- ▶ Area-wide Wi-Fi access and cellular services for disaster response teams (insurance adjusters, aid workers) and the general public.
- ▶ Video surveillance for security and public safety.
- ▶ Other services requiring highly trained disaster recovery specialists.

First American Response Supports these Critical Disaster Restoration Services



The most basic need in any disaster situation is the ability to obtain fresh water. For drinking and cooking.

History has shown the lack of 'potable' water can have a negative impact to recovery, with many disasters being followed close behind by water-borne diseases such as cholera, typhoid and dysentery.

First American addresses this situation by providing abundant fresh water bottled by its tribal partners and transported to the disaster area by other tribal partners.



While the availability of clean water can be a matter of life or death, the restoration of power is critical to recovery efforts and to the resumption of normal life.

First American addresses this need by providing rapidly deployed 'mini' solar power grids which can be used by first responders, aid workers and the general public to support basic needs such as charging cell phones, laptop and tablets.

First American power systems can be used to support aid camps, temporary housing centers, and mobile medical facilities.



TacCom rapid response units are rapidly deployed systems used to aid in disaster recovery, telecom restoration and situations where telecom infrastructure is lacking or disrupted.

TacCom units are modular platforms equipped to provide a wide range of services. Systems are linked by 'least cost' backhaul (including satellite) to provide reliable connectivity from virtually anywhere in the world.

Multiple units can be interconnected to provide wide-area coverage for telecom, Internet access and video surveillance over a large footprint.
